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


# INTRODUCTION


The sheets in 'Classroom Display - Numbers 1 to 20' are designed to be used as classroom displays or for individual, group or class activities to re-inforce the recognition of numbers 1 to 20.

These pages can be used a number of different ways e.g.

- 1] Larger displays can be easily achieved by enlarging the pages to A3 size. The title and page numbers on the bottom of the page can be cut off first with a pair of scissors. These displays can be coloured to make them more appealing and laminated for durability.
- The large pictures at the start of the book can be used for classroom display as well as activity sheets for students (the pages which depict the numbers from 3 to 20 each contain one object which is visually different to the others) e.g. visual discrimination, 'Where's Wally?' type games, racing the clock etc.
- These large pages can also be used as starting points for students to collect and cut-out pictures with the same number of objects and pasting them all onto a larger sheet.



- The smaller picture and number cards can be be coloured, displayed or used as a starting point for other games and classroom activities e.g.
  - a) The students can colour and cut out each small picture. These can then be mixed up and sorted into different number groups then pasted together on a large sheet of paper e.g.



b) Multiple copies of each page can be made and used to play a game of concentration. Students are placed into pairs or small groups and the picture cards (2 of each) are shuffled and placed face down on the desk. The students take it in turns to turn over a picture card. When they


match two cards they keep them. The person with the most pairs at the end of the game is the winner.


- c) One copy of each of the picture cards are shuffled and each student is dealt 4 to 6 cards which
  - are placed face up in front of them. The teacher or a student calls out or holds up a card with a number on it. If the student has a picture with that many objects they place a counter on it. When they have all of their pictures covered they call out 'Bingo'.
  - d) The pictures, numbers and numerals can be cut apart. The students have to match the word or number to the correct picture and paste it onto a piece of paper.
  - e) The students can choose a number and paste it onto a large sheet of paper. They then find that correct number of pictures to match and paste around it.
- 5] The pages at the back of the book contain N.S.W., Queensland and Victorian scripts. These can be pasted over other pages in the book before photocopying in order to modify the font to match your state.


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
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
























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















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



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




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





