



Introduction

This book has been developed to reinforce the recognition of single sounds.

Students need to be competent in their knowledge of single sounds before they can progress to more complex phonetic patterns and phonemes.


The sounds in the book are in alphabetical order, but it is suggested that they be treated in the following order:-

There are two pages of activities for each sound:-


- An art/craft activity using a picture starting with the sound. The students are also asked to trace the sound being treated.
- The students trace the sound, colour the pictures starting with the sound and then construct a 'sound cube'.

These pages should be used in conjunction with many other activities designed to help students recognise single sounds.

- © Colour the apple with red or green crayon or paint.
- Dip a cotton bud in black paint and print ants on the apple.
- When it is dry add details on the ants with texta.
- Trace over the 'a' sounds in the sentence.

© Draw your own 'a' picture in the blank square.


Cut along the straight lines and fold along the dotted lines. Glue it together to make a cube.

The baby has a blue bib.


- © Colour in the baby with crayon or pencil.

- © Draw your own 'b' picture in the blank square.







There are candles on the cake.




- © Colour the 'c' pictures.

- © Draw your own 'c' picture in the blank square.




My dog Dan has lots of dots.

- Trace over the 'd' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'd' pictures.

- Draw your own 'd' picture in the blank square.




My elephant eats lots of Easter eggs.


- © Colour in the Easter eggs inside the elephant in bright colours.

- Trace the 'e' sounds and give the elephant a name starting with 'E'.




- © Colour in the big 'Ee' sounds.

- © Draw your own 'e' picture in the blank square.










- © Draw a different facial expression on each face e.g. happy, sad, frightened, excited, angry etc.

- Trace over the 'f' sound.






- © Colour the 'f' pictures.

The girl has her own garden.


- © Draw the girl's garden and colour the picture.
- Trace over the 'g' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'g' pictures.

- © Draw your own 'g' picture in the blank square.






My hat has hearts on it.


- Trace over the hearts on the hat and colour them in bright colours.

- Trace over the 'h' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'h' pictures.

- © Count the number of each type of creature and write it in the correct space.




Trace over the 'i' sounds in the words.


There are jellybeans in the jar.

- Trace over the 'j' sounds.






- © Colour the 'j' pictures.

- Draw your own 'j' picture in the blank square.




The kangaroo has a kite.

- Trace over the 'k' sounds.






- © Colour the 'k' pictures.

- Trace over the 'l' sounds in the sentence.







- © Can you draw a maze of your own?




Trace over the 'm' sounds in the words.

© Draw your own 'm' picture in the blank square.




Mum has a nice necklace.

- Trace over the 'n' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'n' pictures.

- © Draw your own 'n' picture in the blank square.




Olly octopus has lots of 'o' pictures.

- Trace over the 'o' words in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'o' pictures.

- © Draw your own 'o' picture in the blank square.




My pink pig has lots of patterns.

- Trace over the 'p' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'p' pictures.

- Trace over the 'qu' words in the sentence.





- Trace over the 'r' sounds in the sentence.





- Trace over the 's' sounds in the sentence.






Two furtles near a fent.





Who is under the umbrella?


- © Draw someone or something under the umbrella.

- Trace over the 'u' sounds in the sentence.












- © Colour in the big 'Uu' sounds.

- Trace over the 'u' sounds in the sentence.






- Colour the 'v' pictures.

- Draw your own 'v' picture in the blank square.




There are wiggly worms.

- Trace over the 'w' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'w' pictures.

- © Draw your own 'w' picture in the blank square.




- © Trace around the boxes.

- Trace over the 'x' sounds in the sentence.






- © Colour the 'x' pictures.

- Trace over the 'y' sounds in the sentence.






© Colour the 'y' pictures.

- Trace over the 'z' sounds in the sentence.




