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



- You can use fancy lettering or other eyecatching tricks but make sure that the message can still be read easily.







A biography of a character from a story can be written in many different ways. Rather than just write down a list of facts, some of these other ideas can be tried:

WRITING IDEAS

- Make up a birth certificate.
- Write a school report.
- Create some letters that have been written to and by the character.
- Draw some pictures showing important events in their life.
- Create a driver's license and other documents.
- Make a passport.
- You could even make a death certificate.
- You can publish a biography of a character by collecting all of the documents together into a book or folder.

An autobiography is the story of a person's life told by the person themselves.

You can also publish your own autobiography.

WRITING IDEAS

- A really good test is to read the instructions aloud to a blindfolded friend and see if they can follow them correctly.



WRITING IDEAS

Imaginary Worlds

- Create a whole new place. Somewhere nobody else has ever been to or ever seen. It could be an imaginary place here on Earth, like an uncharted island or, in the far reaches of space, an entire alien planet.
- To create an island you first need to draw a map of it on a piece of paper. Use some mapping symbols (or make up your own) to describe your new land. Put in mountains, rivers, swamps, highways, villages, airports, railways, cities, towns, jungles, coral reefs or whatever you wish.
- Next you can start to describe your land by giving it a name and telling a bit of it's history. Who discovered it? When? How? What type of people first settled there? What type live there now?
- Write something about the economy of your land. Do the people grow or manufacture anything? Do they import or export goods? What does their money look like? What is its value? Draw some examples of the notes and coins.
